And doesn't have to be expensive

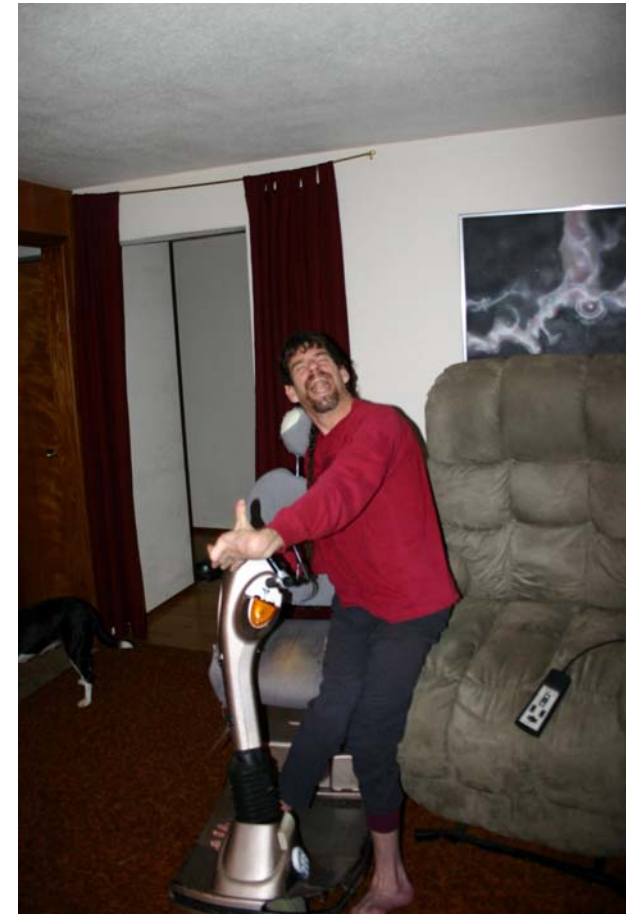
A Bidet Toilet Seat

Keeping an eye on activity without being invasive supports individual choice and freedom safely.



A Pocket Gate was added to provide additional separation when needed to help honor boundaries





Adequate shared and common space is critical in the home

Glass block wall provides separation of shower from toilet combining visibility and privacy.
